ARIZONA PUBLIC HEALTH ASSOCIATION RESOLUTION

- WHEREAS, In 1976 the membership of the Arizona Public Health Association expressed concern about possible conflicts in the self-regulation of certain industries; and
- WHEREAS, These concerns were specifically directed towards the Livestock Sanitary Board having the statutory responsibility for retail meat inspection and the Dairy Commissioner having the statutory responsibility for dairy and dairy products inspection; and
- WHEREAS, Further investigation has shown that there are not ties between the offices of the Dairy Commissioner and the Dairy Industry; and
- WHEREAS, By virtue of H.B. 2047 the authority and responsibility for the inspection of meat and meat products at the retail level was returned to the appropriate authorities; and
- WHEREAS, Further investigation indicates that the staff of the Dairy Commissioner's Office is fulfilling its responsibilities in an unbiased and professional manner,
- BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Arizona Public Health Association commends the members of the State Legislature for their responsible actions in the support and passage of H.B. 2047, and
- BE IT THEREFORE FURTHER RESOLVED that the Association commends the staff of the Dairy Commissioner's Office for the professional nammer in which they are discharging their responsibilities.
