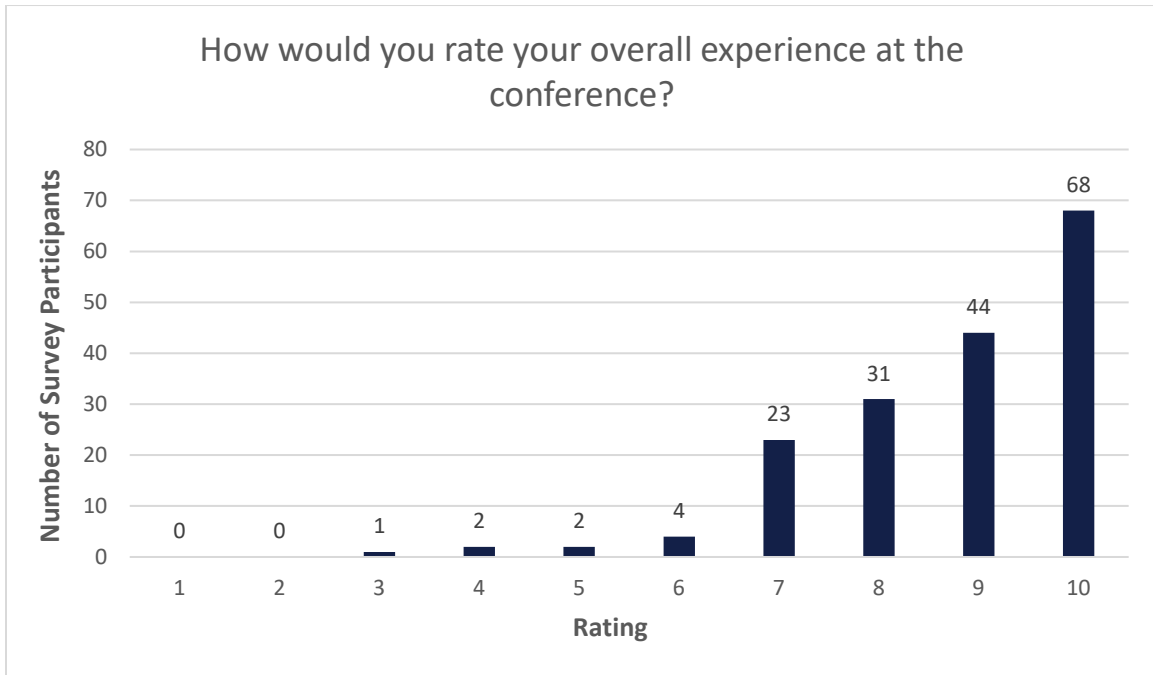

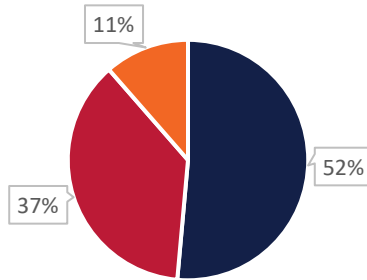

How did the opportunity to receive a scholarship for the registration fee influence your attendance?

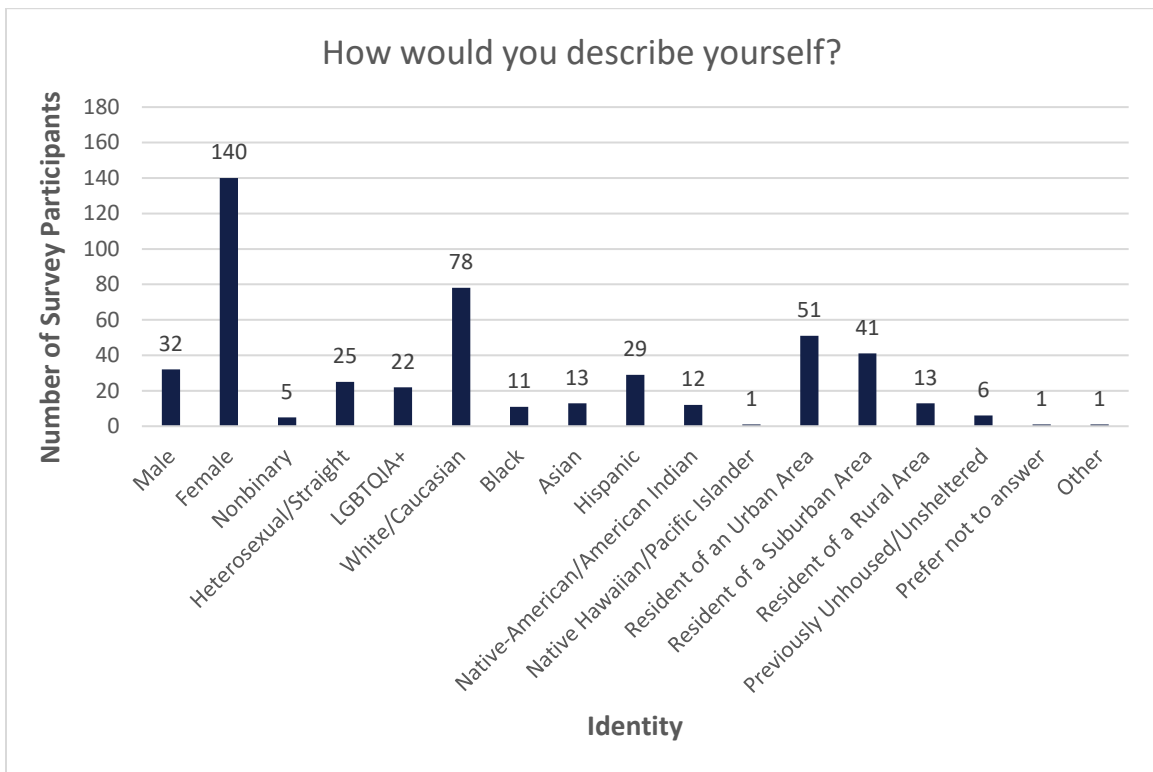
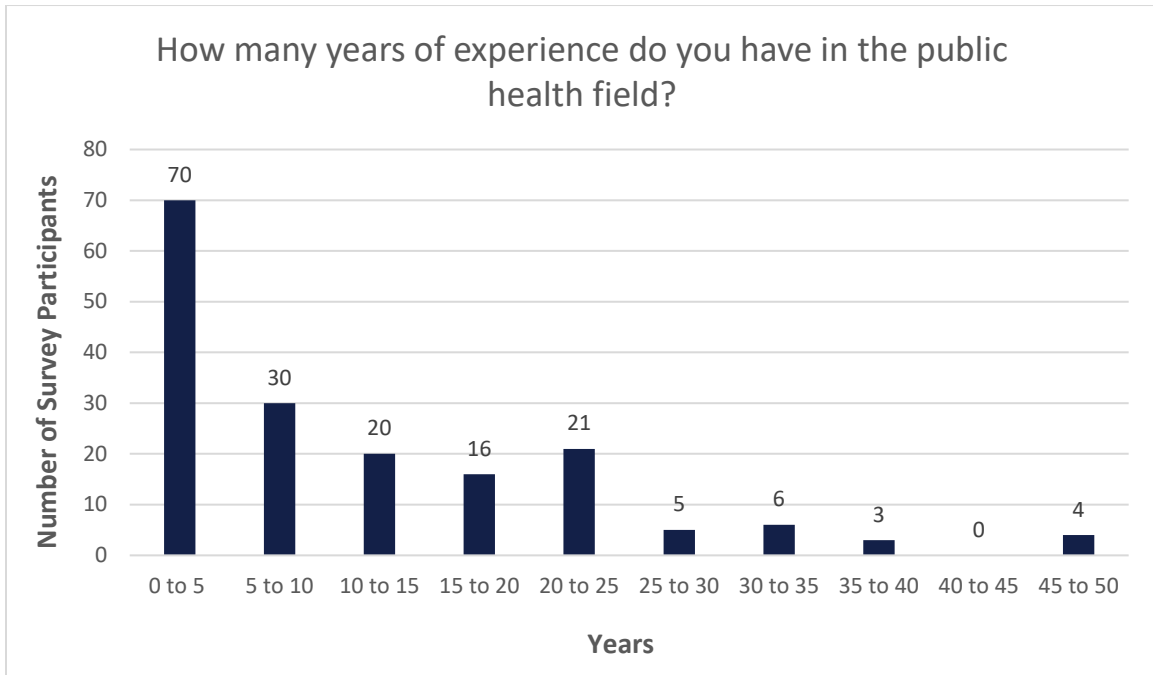


- I could not have attended the conference if the registration cost was left to myself or my employer

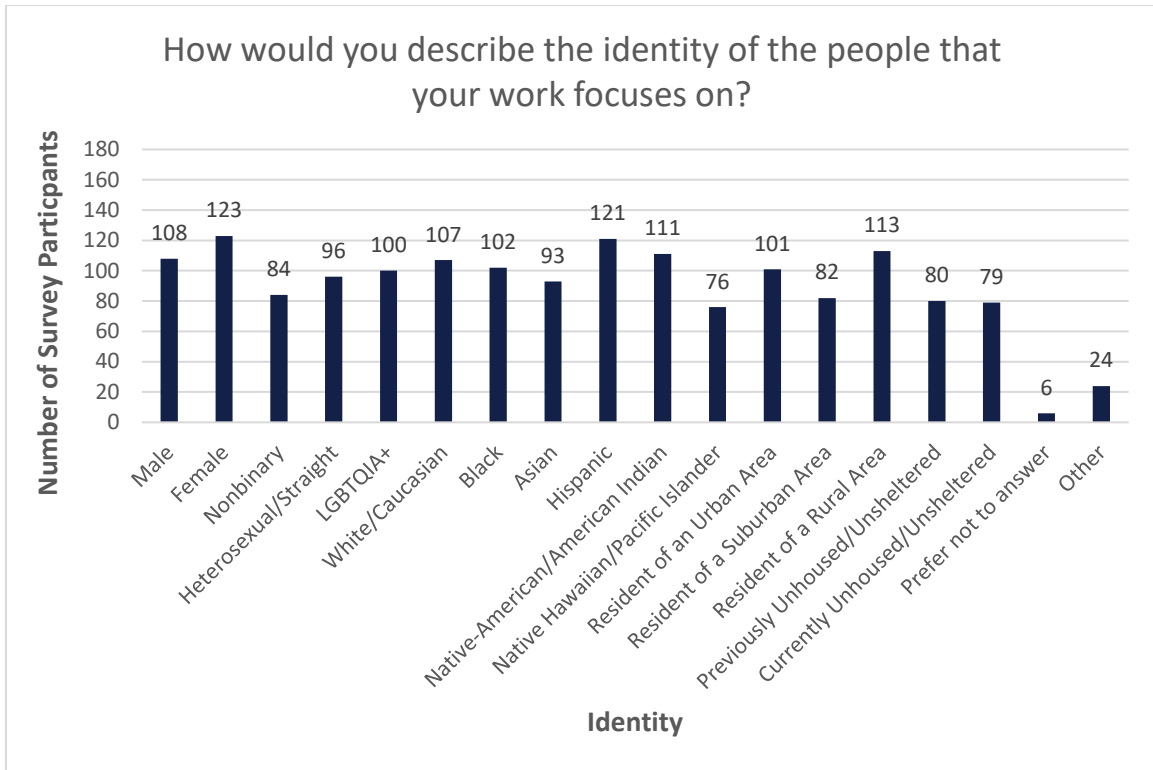
- Undecided. It would depend on the cost.
